




Early-career researcher

Try new things


Build networks



- Discover new directions for your research
- Expand your networks

Research grants

For junior <u>as well as</u> senior researchers

Postdoc and mobility grants - common themes



- Limited by years after PhD (often 2-4 years)
- No participating researchers allowed
- 2 3 years salary
- Paid as a fixed amount, often adjusted to the country where the postdoc is made
- If you go abroad: relocation money often included
- Some include family allowance (e.g. additional money for accompanying spouse and/or children)
- Commonly, the grant must be administered by an a Swedish HEI or administrating organization, by which you are employed throughout the grant period

Early career research grants: common themes

- Include, e.g., starting grants, early-career grants, junior grants etc
- Build your own group
- Limited by years after PhD (often max 8 years)
- 4 5 years salary, but varies
- Participating researchers may be allowed, but varies
- If you go abroad: relocation money often included






Simple search:

Type freely into the search box. An auto-suggester will present disciplines, funders and award types.




Advanced search:

Your results contain a summary of each funding opportunity. You can sort your results by using the toolbar. By clicking on the title, further information of a funding opportunity is obtained.




Save a search:

Click on the "Save" button, to save your search criteria.

Create an email alert:

Choose the "Save and Alert" button in the pop-up window to receive weekly alerts of any new funding opportunities that match your search criteria.
